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Cedrela Tree Planting Project - Cameroon: Maintain Planted Trees And Expand The Project



As a prime aim, we want villagers to see the value in the project and embrace it as a futuristic idea that can lay a solid foundation for their prosperity. We noticed few villagers are reluctant to accept the project, in part, because of its long-term rewards in a context where people struggle to meet their daily needs. But it's also a lack of vision to collaborate in common innovative initiatives.

The prospects are high. We see a bright future in these communities. We want villagers to continue to empower themselves. So Treff-End plans more workshops to raise awareness, find other projects and take part in implementing them with the villagers.

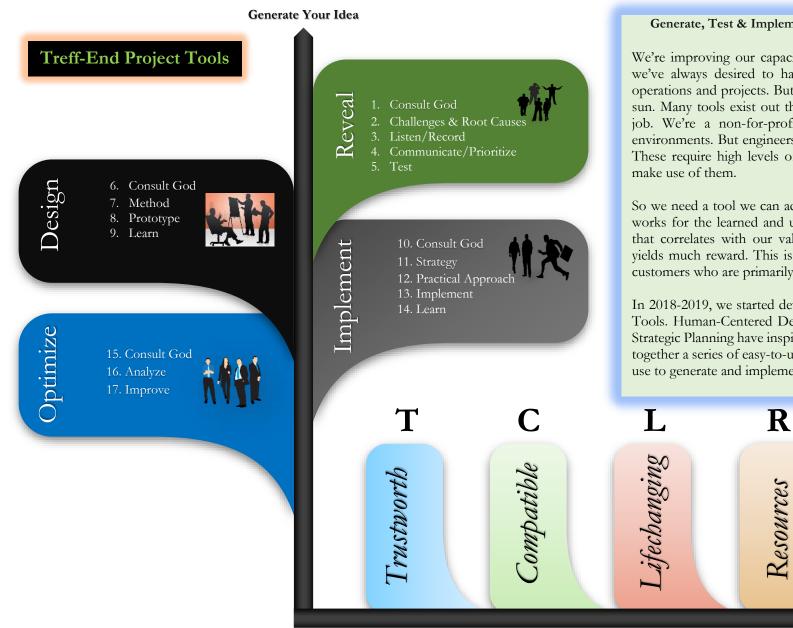
We're delighted in the proper growth of the cedrela trees we planted. And of course, hope regenerates in our hearts to see we can revive the local forest with cedrela species and make sure we continue to generate raw materials for future innovative projects.

As stated in our research, cedrela mexicana species do well on this part of the country with its rich soils and climate. The Mahogany shoot borer (Hypsipyla grandella) attacked none of the trees as common in Latin America. This confirms the excellent results in Africa, researchers say, where the native shoot borer doesn't attack the plant.







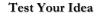


Generate, Test & Implement Your Idea In Four Steps

We're improving our capacities to serve in the field. And we've always desired to have a unique tool to ease our operations and projects. But there's nothing new under the sun. Many tools exist out there that can do a phenomenal job. We're a non-for-profit entity operating in remote environments. But engineers build most tools for business. These require high levels of competence and expertise to make use of them.

So we need a tool we can adapt in all contexts. One which works for the learned and unlearned. And we want a tool that correlates with our values and vision, costs less but yields much reward. This is the best way to empower our customers who are primarily in remote areas.

In 2018-2019, we started developing the Treff-End Project Tools. Human-Centered Design, Project Management and Strategic Planning have inspired us. Our aim has been to put together a series of easy-to-use tools in a pattern anyone can use to generate and implement an idea.









To generate and implement an idea using Treff-End Project Tools, one goes through four steps as shown on the right.

Reveal: God inspires one or a group of people with an idea to solve a specific challenge affecting people. He/she or the group organizes, tests and communicates the idea to potential stakeholders.

Design: With God's help, they find a method to carry out the idea in the field. This could be a simple structure where they assign tasks to each other. They develop a prototype and continue to improve the idea until it's ready for implementation.

Implement: One needs a strategy and a practical approach to succeed in the field. So this stage helps one or the group to evaluate resources to come up with a realistic one.

Optimize: It's not enough to start an idea. One has to improve it and make sure it continues to exist and yield the targeted profits amid emerging challenges.

The Christian faith inspires Treff-End's values and guides its operations. We want people to be aware this planet isn't our permanent home. So our primary aim is to prepare them for Jesus' return. While doing that, we trust God to give us wisdom to use available resources to improve our lives and those of others. For an idea to match this goal, it must sufficiently pass the TCLRtest, which helps the entrepreneur stay in line with our vision. The TCLR-test tests four things as shown in the diagram below.

- 2. Does the idea or project target a specific need?
- 3. Will/does the idea or project sufficiently meet that need?
- 4. Can the idea or project be sufficiently accomplished using Godly principles?
- 5. Is the idea or project guided by a Godly vision?

sufficiently pass the TCLR-test? Let's try and see.

Compatible

- Does the idea or project directly or indirectly support the Great Commission?

- 4. Does the idea or project match cultural and environmental norms?
- 5. Have the designers and implementers sufficiently considered other implementation barriers?

- 2. What's the visible or forecasted number of men and women of God assisted in the mission field?
- 3. What's the visible or forecasted improvement in terms of spiritual needs of beneficiaries?
- 4. What's the visible or forecasted improvement in terms of physical needs of beneficiaries?
- 5. Is the idea or project contributing to your own spiritual and physical growth?

Resources

- 1. Are human & spiritual resources available or enough?
- 2. Are material & financial resources available or enough?
- 3. Is there an effective strategy to obtain lacking human, spiritual, material, & financial resources?
- Are all necessary approvals & assistances from other important stakeholders secured?
- 5. Is the implementation timetable realistic?
